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Jean Monnet module of Population and human capital policy in the European Union

Call for course proposals

The Jean Monnet module of Population and human capital policy in the European Union at Universitatea Alexandru Ioan Cuza din Iasi (www.fssp.uaic.ro/monnet) invites colleagues to submit proposals for short teaching modules (four hours each) to be integrated in the activities of the Jean Monnet module.

Objectives

The objectives of this call are the following:

- support for young researchers (i.e. who have obtained a PhD degree in the last five years) and university teachers who want to carry out research and teaching on EU subjects;
- increased opportunities for academic staff in terms of professional and career development;
- to create interest in the EU and constitute the basis for a future pole of European knowledge.

Requirements of the teaching proposals

The teaching proposals shall consist of four hours of teaching, of which two hours of lectures and two hours of seminars. Teaching shall be on any aspect related to population and human capital policy in the European Union, which includes a wide variety of topics (e.g. migration policy in the EU, demography and elections in the EU, demography of religion in the EU, demography and security in Europe, EU social policies, EU education policies...).

Requirements of the proposing teachers

The proposing teachers must have a PhD or equivalent and show evidence of experience/interest in teaching and research on EU-related subjects.

Selection criteria

There shall be up to a maximum of seven teaching blocks financed by this call per academic year. The selection criteria shall be the following:

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- the extent to which the proposal involves key academic staff demonstrating an excellent profile and qualifications in specific fields of European Union studies, documented by evidence of high level activities;
- the pertinence of the profile and expertise of key academic staff involved with the activities carried out in the project.

Submission guidelines

Proposals shall contain:

- A brief description of the content of the course in Romanian and English (max. 200 words).
- A short reading list.
- A brief narrative CV of the proposing teacher in Romanian and English (max. 200 words).

Proposals shall be submitted by mail to the coordinator of the module, Dr Diego Varela (diego.varela@uaic.ro) by the end of March 2015.

Selection procedure

Selection will be made by the coordinator of the module on the basis of the proposal and the reports of at least two external anonymous reviewers.

Benefits

Participating teachers will

- be paid from the module's budget at the standard hourly rate;
- receive a certificate of participation in the module.

Obligations of the beneficiaries

Participating teachers commit themselves to

- contribute to the module's teaching according to their proposals;
- contribute to the promotion and dissemination of the module's activities.
